

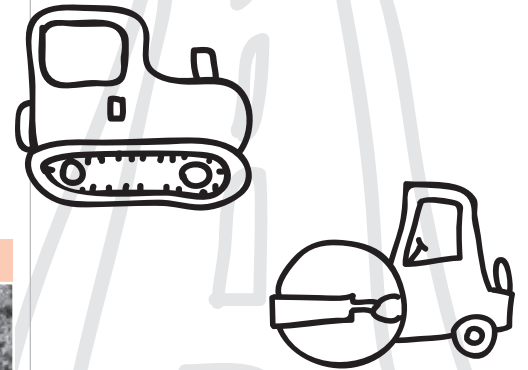
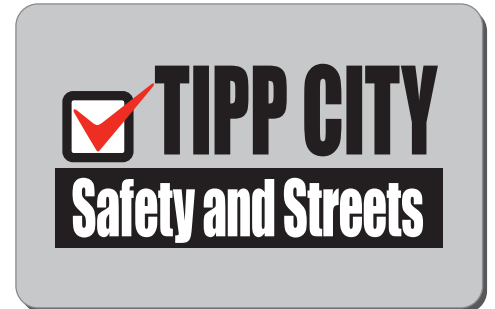

Capital Improvement Tax Levy

In 2010 the City had 56 miles of Streets (117 lane miles). At that time, the City was only able to repave roadways about every thirty (30) years. From 2008-2011, due to budgetary constraints, the City was forced to stop paving streets in order to maintain a balanced budget.

The 0.50% Tax Levy allowed the City to once again start repaving the streets in Tipp City. The plan recommended by the Committee allocated \$400,000 per year for repaving. The City has been able to invest more each year in repaving projects. ●

Fire Safety in the Kitchen

Tipp City Fire & Emergency Services keeps the safety of our citizens as a top priority. October contains National Fire Prevention Week, October 4-10. The theme this year is “Serve Up Fire Safety in the Kitchen!”

Is the Kitchen Your Safe Place?

For many, it's the metaphorical heart of your home where you go for nourishment, both physical and emotional, and come together with family and friends to share meals and spend quality time. However, the kitchen is also the area that poses the most significant threat of fire and requires the highest level of safety. Cooking is by far the leading cause of home fires and related injuries, with an average of 173,200 incidents reported to US fire departments annually.

Kitchen Safety Tips

1. The kitchen is a no play zone
2. Keep distractions at a minimum; example put your phone down while cooking
3. Teach children to leave the stove and pots and pans on the stove alone
4. Teach children the proper use of cooking appliances at age appropriate levels

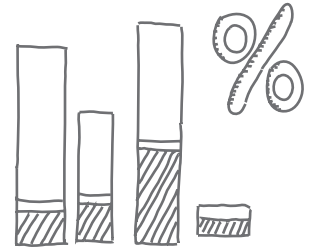


Please keep in mind that a kitchen is a place of great memories of family meals and spending time together. The kitchen is also a working area that presents a level of danger to the unaware.

Tipp City Leaf Pickup Schedule for 2020

The Tipp City Street Department will be starting the leaf pickup program soon. There are a few important guidelines to follow. Residents are asked to rake leaves into the street, one foot from the curb, so that storm water will drain. Please, **NO limbs, sticks, bricks, rocks or yard debris should be placed with the leaves in the street.** These items cause damage to the equipment, create down time for repairs, and add delay to the leaf pickup schedule.


Oct. 12 – Oct. 16 & Nov. 9 – Nov. 13
Areas throughout the City as needed.
Areas between I-75 and N. Hyatt St. (north of W. Main St.) No pickup on Veteran's Day, Nov. 11.

Oct. 19 – Oct. 23 & Nov. 16 – Nov. 20
All areas East of Hyatt St. (north and south of Main St.)

Oct. 26 – Oct. 30 & Nov. 23 – Nov. 25
Areas between I-75 and S. Hyatt St. (south of W. Main St.) No pickup on Thanksgiving Day, Nov. 26 or the day after, Nov. 27.

Nov. 2 – Nov. 6 & Nov. 30 – Dec. 4
Areas West of I-75 (north and south of Main St.)

Dec. 7 – Dec. 11
Clean up throughout the City as needed ●
